# About the Redondo Beach Bluffs Restoration Project

The goal of the Redondo Beach Bluffs Restoration Project is to return a diverse community of native shrubs and wildflowers to the coastal bluffs along Redondo's shore. Native shrubs and wildflowers are adapted to Southern California's climate, and therefore require less maintenance and water. They also attract wildlife, beautify the landscape, and stabilize the slope better than exotic species.

The Stewards of the Bluffs Program is aimed at maintaining this project through weeding, litter removal, and some planting and seeding. Each Saturday, from 10AM-2PM, volunteers are invited to join the SEA Lab in these activities. People of all ages and experience levels are invited. All you need to bring is a concern for the environment and a willingness to get your hands dirty. We meet each week under the big blue sign between Avenue I and Vista Del Mar, so come on down and join in -- and don't forget a bottle of water, a hat and sunscreen!
